This message is from the city of Toronto Food Handler Certification Program.

Effective October 1, 2017, Toronto enforcement staff will accept food handler certificates issued by training providers recognized by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care.

Holders of food handler certificates issued by the recognized training providers will no longer need to apply and convert their certificate for one issued by Toronto's Medical Officer of Health.

The pertinent sections of Municipal Code Chapter 545, Licensing, regarding this matter will be addressed in the future.
